President's Report

It is a great honour to present my first Annual Report as president following on from Wally Bell, who was at the helm for five very successful years.

The 2020 season has been like no other with COVID-19 forcing many changes, some of which may stay with us for a long time. In March we were forced to close the club as we tried to deal with the large amount of government regulation imposed on the club. This was undoubtedly a challenging time for the Committee as we quickly got up to speed with the COVID rules and regulations and implemented strategies to allow us to proceed as usual.

Despite COVID, we were able to field competitive Senior Men's and Women's teams each week. In one of the closest competition in years our First grade team had opportunities to claw our way to the top of the table, but unfortunately, we fell short in a few key games which meant that we finished third which made our draw in the finals difficult. Unfortunately, a few injuries to key players cost us in the finals. Like the First grade, Second grade also missed a few opportunities during the year to finish in the top two and get a favourable draw. Second grade also lost players to work commitments and injuries which adversely affected their performance in the finals. Third grade was unlucky not to make the finals with a couple of results in the last round not going our way.

Our Women's team were going well until mid-season when they too were affected by injuries. The Women's team played an exciting brand of attacking rugby which drew a lot of supporters. However, the team's defence and in particular the try line defence were the highlights of the year. In the semifinal, the team only had 15 fit players available with an injured reserve on the bench. The game was played in hot weather which made it difficult with no fit replacements available. Despite this, the players defended their try line admirably and should be proud of their performance.

Overall, our Junior teams performed strongly with the U14, U16 and U18 all making the grand final. We had more Junior teams in the grand final than any other club. Congratulations to the U14 and U16 for winning the grand final. The U16 game was nerve-wracking with Burnside scoring in the last minute to achieve a close victory. The U18 match was equally tense, but unfortunately, we were unable to score the winning try and were narrowly defeated. All of our Junior teams are to be congratulated on a fantastic season. Our Junior grades are all looking good with outstanding player registrations, good quality coaches and managers and terrific support from parents.

One of the most pleasing aspects of the Senior performances this year was the progression of many Junior players into Senior rugby, and we are very excited by the level of talent and future potential of many of these players. We are confident that with a big offseason that many of these players are capable of playing in the top grades for many years to come.

Despite the many COVID related challenges we faced, our coaches and managers are to be congratulated for their outstanding efforts in season 2020. We managed to field a team in every grade every week and our coaches and managers led by example in implementing our COVID safety management plans.

In addition to our success on the field, we also achieved a significant milestone with the Burnside Council agreeing to support the construction of a new clubhouse. This approval was the culmination of years of hard work by cricket and rugby. The Council approval is just the first step, and we still need to get financial support from State and Federal governments before any construction can commence. If our current rate of progress continues, then we are confident that we will be able to start construction within the next 18 months.

Even though the businesses of all of our sponsors were also adversely affected by COVID-19, we are incredibly grateful for the support that they gave us in these difficult times. A club our size would not operate without the generous support of our sponsors, and we certainly acknowledge the support of all sponsors, but in particular, our Double Blue sponsors SADB and Voiteck. SADB has been a significant sponsor of the club for 25 years, and their continued support has been crucial to our success. There are too many sponsors to name individually, but please accept our thanks on behalf of the club.

This year saw the introduction of five new committee members. It is undoubtedly a very hard-working committee, and each member is to be congratulated for their hard work and success in 2020. The Committee acted quickly and efficiently when confronted with COVID and in particular our ability to make tough decisions in the best interest of our players and supporters. For example, within days of the COVID shutdown we had: formulated and implemented detailed COVID safety management plans; significantly reduced player registration fees to help our players who were also facing COVID financial difficulties; implemented changes to improve the game-day experience and maximise game-day revenue. It has certainly been surprising how much the Committee has been able to achieve in such a short amount of time.

While we are appreciative of the support of our major sponsors, one of the biggest surprises this year has been the support of our players and supporters. The COVID related changes described above and a reduction in significant sponsor revenue meant that we were starting the year about \$30,000 in the red. However, through the support of some players who refused to accept a refund when the fees were lowered and donations and contributions from supporters, we have managed to finish the year in a strong financial position.

Despite all of the challenges we faced, we enjoyed success on and off the field and have finished 2020 in a strong financial position. This could not have been achieved without the support of our volunteers who were cooking BBQs every Thursday and Saturday, setting up and packing down the fields, cleaning the clubrooms and acting as COVID and ground marshals. Also, thanks to all of the staff who made our game day and club experience enjoyable. Lastly, we could not have achieved what we did without the selfless support of the parents, carers, partners and friends who made sure that our players were able to get to training and games. It is said that Burnside has the best supporters in South Australian Rugby and this was proven again in 2020.

We are excited by a number of things both on and off the pitch that will hopefully set the club up for some strong years ahead. We are Adelaide's premier rugby club.

Vice President's Report

In a year of uncertainty and risk, what became obvious was how important rugby was to so many people, young and old, for a variety of different reasons. It was awesome to be a part of the Burnside rugby community.

A quick wrap around the junior teams; 18s; Clearly the best team through the minor rounds, heartbreakingly going to down to OC in the grand final. Still a stellar season with much to be proud of. 16s; Played the game of their lives in the grand final! Massive credit to their never-give-up attitude, which was often put to the test through the season, and they fully deserved their premiership. 14s; A consistently quality season culminating in a dominant grand final win, again, fully deserving of their premiership. 12s; some mixed results during the season but consistently showed improvement. Were unlucky to miss out on finals but their last game v OC finally displayed the self-belief that had been lacking! 10s; Good numbers and a squad that continued to grow as the season went on. Again, some mixed performances but when on song displayed all the elements of quality rugby. 8s; Struggled with numbers especially earlier in the season. However, the small group benefited from close attention from the coach, showing marked improvement in individual skills and confidence through the season. 7s; Nearly half their games through the season managed to run two pitches reflecting strong numbers across many clubs, this also great format for the kids getting ++ game time. By end of season displaying phases of great team play.

A massive thank you to all coaches and managers of our junior teams. We sincerely appreciated your patience and compliance as we changed training times, changed pitch allocations, asked you to bleach kit before and after training etc etc. Even when the COVID dust had mostly settled by the end of the season, leading into finals we still needed to mix up training nights. Credit goes to Phil Doherty for his best efforts to make trainings work for everyone, and on a few occasions "taking one for the team" offering up his U16s to make necessary compromises.

Credit also goes to Kath Devlin-Matthews for her persistence in ensuring all our coaches and managers achieved accreditation. The club benefited from the experience of Nik Nagel as Director of Team Management who guided our managers, assisted with injury paperwork and game day app. It makes it so much easier to encourage volunteers when you can confidently offer them expert support in their roles.

Presentation day will look a little different this year as the cricket season is well underway and covid regulations prevent the usual "shared buffet". We are excited to introduce "50 game shields" for our Juniors, which were made possible by the data collection and mammoth efforts of Tony Bedford over the last couple of years. We intend for the shields to reward loyalty and consistency to the club and hopefully provide an incentive to keep returning for further seasons. In a staggered introduction, this year shields will be presented to the 18s and 16s who have achieved this milestone, and next year we will catch up the backlog presenting to 14s to and below. Going forward, in the season that a player achieves 50 appearances during the home and away games, they will receive their personalised shield. Each year with the club will be engraved onto the shield and a summary plate presented at end of their final season. With resources going into the shield, we've scaled back other trophies and medals for the juniors. U10s- U18s will continue to present 3 awards per team, and players from all grades will receive a certificate with an individualised message from their coach and in 2020 will receive a drink bottle from the club.

There are a number of things I am hoping for the opportunity to implement/oversee in 2021, reappointment to VP and global pandemic willing! Some of these things simply weren't possible for this season, others we ran out of time for but are firmly on agenda going forward;

- "Live" recognition of milestone game appearances each week
- Return of the U14 end of season rugby tour We will initially fundraise and plan for a NZ tour as previously, but if international travel poses too greater risk/problem, we'll explore domestic tour options
- Junior Fun Day a day with fun activities jumpy castle, bubble soccer etc especially for our juniors
- "Buddy" programs between junior and senior teams.
- Pre and post season feedback surveys.

Finally, thanks to the other members of the committee for being a great team to work with under extraordinary circumstances this season. In particular, special thanks to Greg and Kath for all their support to me throughout this year.

7. Secretary's Report

I am privileged to have had the opportunity to be club secretary for a fourth consecutive year and have largely achieved what I had hoped to this year. Our coaches, managers and committee achieved 100% individual compliance with coaching quals, DHS Working with Children Checks, volunteer registration and training in Child Safety, by the start of the original season. Thanks to everyone for understanding the importance of this and replying to my endless emails & messages about your certificates.

One of the first tasks of the year was to set up the committee in G-Suite so that our records became cloud based and fully accessible online. Thanks to Declan who kicked this off. I have transferred the last four years' worth of records, templates, minutes, etc to our drive; a process that will make transition from outgoing officer barer to incoming office barer much easier, not to mention improve communication, document exchange and collaboration among the committee throughout year. It has been a pleasure to work with this committee of professional, dedicated and driven individuals.

Although there are still areas of the website that need updating, I figure that may always be the case! I aimed this year to provide a one-stop-shop, with the intention that new players and families could find the answers to all of their questions on the website, and that all existing club members could feel comfortable directing new people to the site, safe in the knowledge that newbies would find what they needed. The job of website maintenance fell in to my lap a couple of years ago so I am extremely excited to have received an offer of help, from a professional software engineer and web designer no less, so watch this space.

Club Photos were a big success judging by the number of orders and smiles on kids' faces when they saw themselves. We engaged a new photographer from SFX images this year who certainly provided a much higher level of quality photography. Coordinating club photos is a complex and difficult task. I am grateful to those who helped along the way and would like to remind our families that not all clubs organise photos every year. We do so voluntarily and have sought feedback through surveys. It provides a beautiful documentation of our teams and I look forward to volunteers putting their hand up to assist with this as a mini project in 2021.

Sports Vouchers were processed as usual after a virus fuelled false start. The claim process for Rugby in SA is outdated and time consuming but it results in each primary school aged child receiving \$100 reimbursement for their fees. We are committed to continuing the claims as long as the State Government funds the program.

Senior Awards is another area I consulted on this year, seeking information via Louis and Isaac on preferences of trophy or collectable but usable item. We arrived at engraved stemless wineglasses with matching wooden coasters and have heard only positive praise. Well done again to all the winners.

Registration has been in the same application (Rugby Xplorer) again this year and I am so grateful for it (it changed every year for three consecutive years!). What this has meant is that I have become more proficient at using it, and that it has been further developed. Fees were set and later changed but overall, the registration process was simpler this year than in all previous. State transfers, clearances and squad set up is all managed through Xplorer and I'm told there are more improvements in the pipeline for next year. I am looking forward to the club being able to add purchasable items to our app so that tickets for social events can all be bought online through your Rugby Xplorer app. Fingers crossed it comes through in 2021.

I had to sign off on more insurance claims this year than we would have liked (and that I have received in the previous three years ③) but thanks to everyone who worked with me to make a claim.

Should I be voted to sit for another year on the committee, I will be determined to engage some fresh faces and experienced heads to support the club on sub committees and smaller project roles. I am certain that breaking roles in to smaller more palatable portions, will encourage more individual involvement.

My only disappointment this year was that I didn't manage time to do the revamp of the women's and girls change rooms. After consultation with some junior females on what they want, we had a skeleton plan but we may need to pick this project up again next year. Of course we will remain mindful of the bigger plans ahead!

Thanks for your support this year; while the workload can be huge, so is the love. Kath Devlin-Matthews.

8. Treasurer's Report

In an extremely different year we managed to make an overall surplus. This was as a result of a combination of support from our generous sponsors, our members, rent forgiveness from the Burnside City Council, Cash Grants from SARU, the State Government and Australian Tax Office. A new initiative this year was the introduction of tax deductable donations through the Australian Sports Foundation which helped us raise significantly more donations than last year.

Kylie, Megan and their team worked very hard in these difficult circumstances to give us 67% of the Gross Profit we made last year. A big thank you to all those that the supported our Bar & Catering and worked with us to comply with COVID restrictions. Both women and men Calcutta's raised good money for the club.

We managed to contain our expenditure to 65% of last year. The monies raised through the Sports Foundation has been put aside to be spent on new player equipment for next season. As a result of some unexpected grants we managed to put some money aside for the new clubrooms.

A big thank for to all members, donors and sponsors for their financial support during the year, which has resulted in the club ending this difficult year in a healthy financial position.
